Catalyst Program Description

Catalyst Newcastle provides a university program comprising four humanities subjects which contribute to the award of a **Certificate in Liberal Arts**. The first unit, 'Introduction to Ethics' will be taught by Michael Foley from Australian Catholic University and will introduce students to major life questions, ideas and areas of debate in Australia today. Students will also explore the role of ethics in society, particularly in helping people and communities make choices .

The Catalyst Program involves commitment to a weekly lecture and a tutorial session which provides one on one learning support. Computer and library resources will be available.

Catalyst Program Structure

'Introduction to Ethics' runs for 12 weeks (excluding public holidays) from Monday 9th March 2009. The weekly lecture is scheduled on Monday afternoons from 1pm to 3pm and the Learning Partner session is scheduled on Wednesday evenings 5.30pm-730pm.
