Unique opportunity to hear Fr Richard Lennan

Richard Lennan, a priest of the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle, is Professor of Systematic Theology in the School of Theology and Ministry at Boston College.

He studied at the University of Newcastle, the Catholic Institute of Sydney, the University of Oxford, and the University of Innsbruck in Austria, where he completed his doctorate with a dissertation on the theology of church in the work of Karl Rahner. Fr Lennan has authored or edited five books and numerous articles on issues in ecclesiology, ecumenism, the theology of ministry, and fundamental theology.

Prior to moving to Boston in 2007, he spent fifteen years on the faculty of the Catholic Institute of Sydney. His previous work also included a term as President of the Australian Catholic Theological Association, and wide involvement in ecumenical activities and pastoral planning in Australia and New Zealand.
