


The Bishop of Maitland, James
Murray, brought the Dominican
Sisters to the diocese Dun Laoghaire,
Ireland in 1867, and the Sisters of
Mercy from Ennis Ireland in 1875

In the wake of withdrawal of State Aid from denominational schools from 1882, Bishop Murray brought the Patrician Brothers and Brigidine Sisters from Ireland in 1883



In September 1883 **Bishop Murray brought** the Sisters of St Joseph, to Lochinvar from Perthville in the Bathurst Diocese to educate poor children especially in the isolated rural areas of his vast diocese







Four young Sisters led by Sr Ambrose
Joseph Dirkin arrived at Lochinvar on
2 September 1883









